The Druid

An unusual sight, this grave marks a druid who died in 1935 at 90 years old.

Warstone Lane Cemetery contains 51 WWI burials and 14 from WWII. This wall commemorates by name those whose graves are not marked by headstones.

Sutcliffe

This grave marker has been carefully crafted to look like a tree stump, complete with ferns and ivy for L & I Sutcliffe.

This octagonal gravestone looks unremarkable at first glance but it marks the first person to be buried in Warstone Cemetery in 1848.

The War Stone

Near the Wall is the War Stone, a glacial erratic made from the volcanic rock felstone, which was carried here from its parent rock in Wales by glacial ice.
